Description of the match:

The fifth-place final in this FIFA CWC 2012. The match was played between the teams defeated in the quarterfinal matches: Ulsan Hyundai from Korea Republic and Sanfrecce Hiroshima from Japan. Toyota Stadium, with a capacity of 45000, presented an attendance of 17581, therefore it was almost empty. Weather conditions were good, sunny day and no problems for the pitch. No pressure for the referee, also considering the low importance of the match, so he was able to work in the best possible way. The first match in this competition for Nawaf Shukrallah from Bahrain.

Referee

Comments:

Shukralla adapted his style to the match. He had an easy approach in first half, also thank to the fairness of the players. When he noticed that the game was going to live a more intensive moment, he immediately used the cards, showing also his authority. A quite easy first half with one correct card given (reckless tackle) and overall a good foul detection. There is something more to say about the second half, which was more intensive and with some interesting situations, especially in the last minutes. The referee had not problems to handle the match under his control. The only remarkable situation is a small riot happened in the 90' minute, after a whistled foul. Shukralla was able to calm down the situation, showing the correct cards to the players which were responsible for that situation. The other cards given in second half were for clear and irregular actions. The only doubtful situation of the whole match could be the episode happened in the 82', when Sanfrecce's keeper was fouled unintentionally by an opponent, which tried to make a late attempt to hit the ball. In y opinion, here a YC would have been appropriate. Prboably, the only mistake of the match by the referee.

Minute	Description of the situation
4'	Good advantage given to Ulsan.
18'	Correct free kick whistled for a foul by Mzumoto (Sanfrecce) near the penalty area and very good interaction with players, explaining the reasons of the decision.
29'	Ho (Ulsan) commits a blatant foul. Referee tries to wait for a possible advantage, then he whistles. Correct decision. The game until now is very fair and cards are not still needed.
34'	The number of fouls is increasing in this part of the game. Referee shows the first YC of the match to Ho (Ulsan) which committs his third foul in a short time. Reckless tackle, also for this reason correct and appropriate decision.
66'	Seok Ho (Sanfrecce) is correctly booked by the referee for a dangerous tackle on the opponent.
82'	Rafinha (Ulsan) tries to hit the ball when already caught by keeper. He unintentionally kicks the hands of the opponent. No whistle by the referee, he considered it as a regular action. Game is resumed after 4 minutes due to the injury of the keeper
88'	Shiotani (Sanfrecce) is correctly booked for a blatant pulling the shirt of the opponent.
90'	After a whistled foul, a small riot happens. Referee is immediately on the middle to calm down the situation, which returns normal. Rafinha (Usaln) and Shusaku (Sanfrecce) are booked.
90'	Correct decision to add 4 minutes as injury time, due to situation happened in 82'.
90'+4	Good advantage given to Sanfrecce on a counterattack.

Comments:

Shukralla had a very good tactical approach because he was able to read the progress of the game. He showed an excellent use of the advantage. The match control was overall ok, until the last minutes it was an easy work, then he had to calm down a small riot. He did it well. Furthermore, he showed his skill to communicate with players, explaining always his decisions and talking to the players. Clear gestures and awareness of the game in progress.

In my opinion, he can be listed as candidate for the final match on the next 16 December, since all the Asian teams are now out from the tournament.

Comments:

The second assistant was for sure the busiest man of the whole referee's team. He had to face several situations, which were important for the outcome of the game. The match can be judged as CHALLENGING also for him, a bit more than his colleague, but not still VERY CHALLENGING. The first situation, listed in the 22' minute, is just a remark. When the TV wasn't able to help us in the evaluation, I gave trust to him.

Minute	Description of the situation
22'	Might have raised the flag for a possible active position of a Sanfrecce player, following the shot of a teammate on a corner nick action, by the way the ball was out of the goal so maybe for this reason he let the game flow. The player in offside was obstructing keeper's view. This is just a remark, I of course don't consider this situation as mistake.
26'	Koji (Sanfrecce) is ruled offside. No replay from tv, so we have to trust the assistant. The feeling is that the decision was correct.
35'	Good evaluation of the situation prior to the 1-1, all the positions were onside.
59'	Shinwook (Ulsan) is flagged offside on a long ball: correct decision.
60'	Kauhno (Usan) is flagged offside on a long ball: no replay from tv but the decision seems correct.
63'	Shinwook (Ulsan) is flagged offside on a long ball: no replay but the decision should be correct.

Fourth Official

Comments:

Peter O'Leary is an experienced FIFA referee with many important tournaments in his experience, and therefore he was able to recognize when players tried to waste time, leaving the pitch too slowly prior to the substitution.
